sinned through our own deliberate fault. We are  
truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us,  
for our Saviour Christ's sake, and renew our lives  
to the glory of your name. Amen.**

pardon you, and set you free. Know that you are  
forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all  
goodness and keep you in life eternal.
